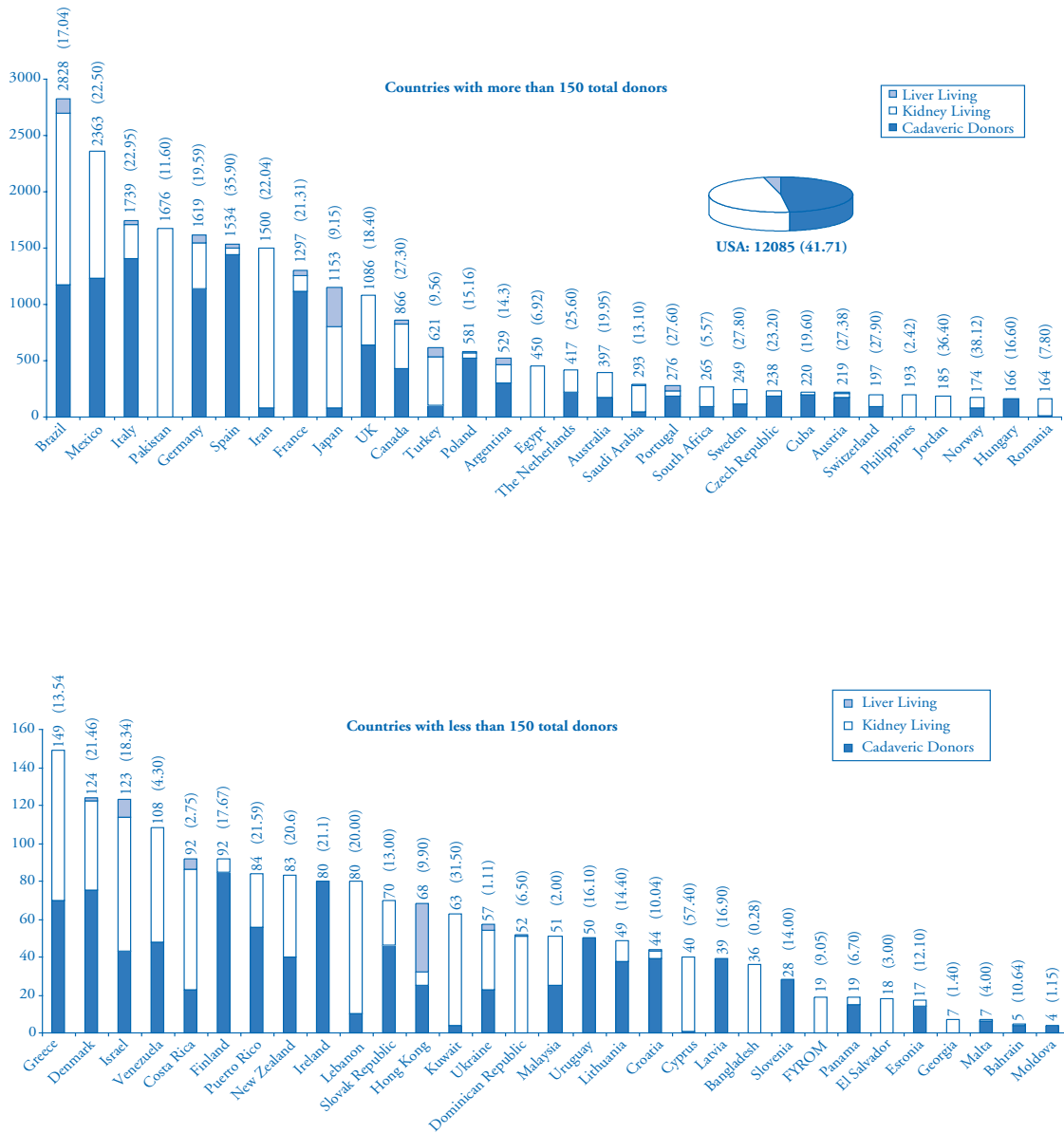


FIGURE 2 - Cadaveric vs. Living Kidney Transplants 2003.

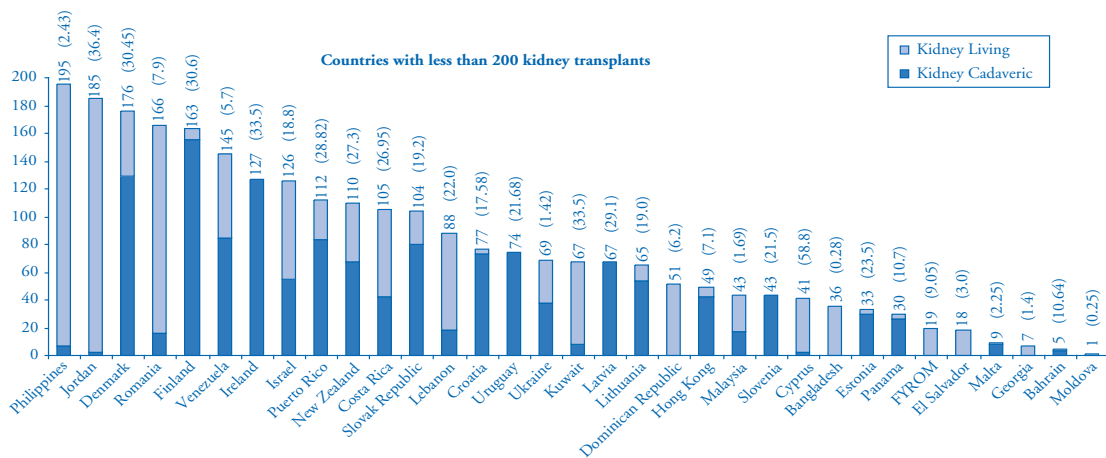
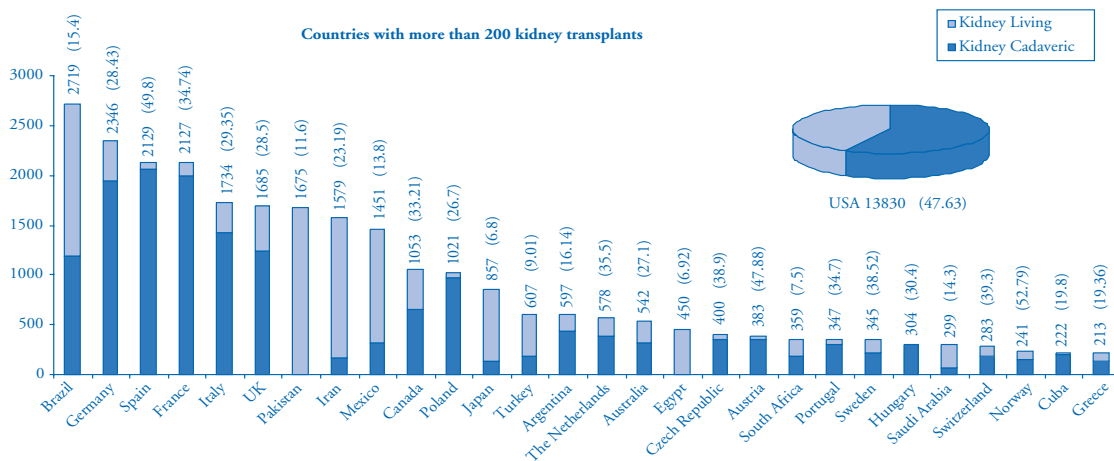


FIGURE 3 - Cadaveric Pancreas Transplants 2003.

The countries are ranked by the absolute values of donors (Fig.1) and transplants (Fig.2-6). In order to display it the clearest way, each rank of Fig.1 and Fig.3 is divided in two graphs, according to the number of donors and transplants respectively (please note that the scale of the second graph has been increased). Considering that the values from USA are over four times higher than the next country, it is represented by a single figure in all the cases. The top of each column shows the total number of donors or transplants (depending on the figures) of the country represented. In brackets there is the corresponding total p.m.p. rate.

FIGURE 1 - Cadaveric vs. Living Donors 2003.

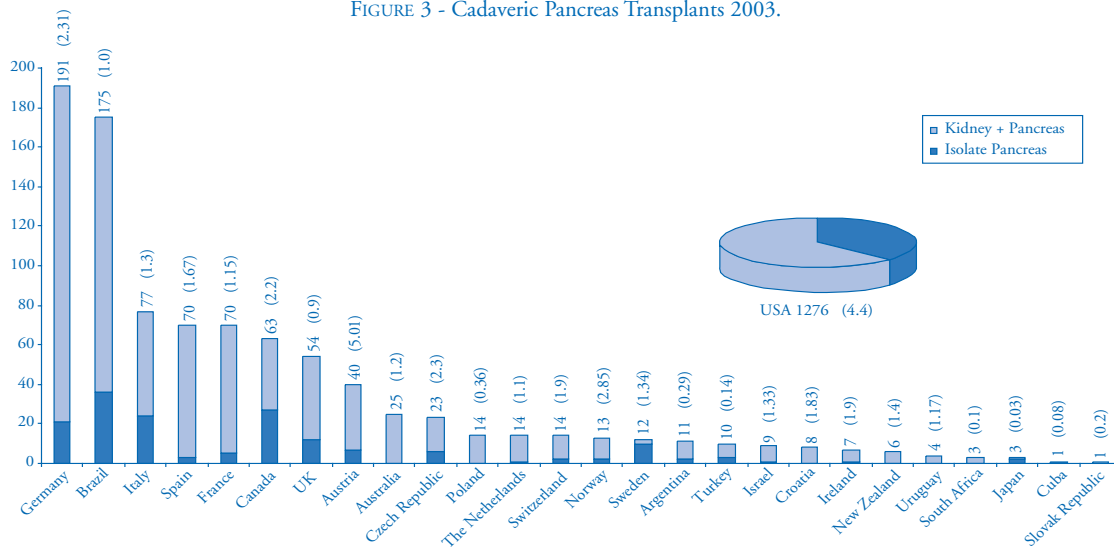


FIGURE 4 - Cadaveric vs. Living Liver Transplants 2003.

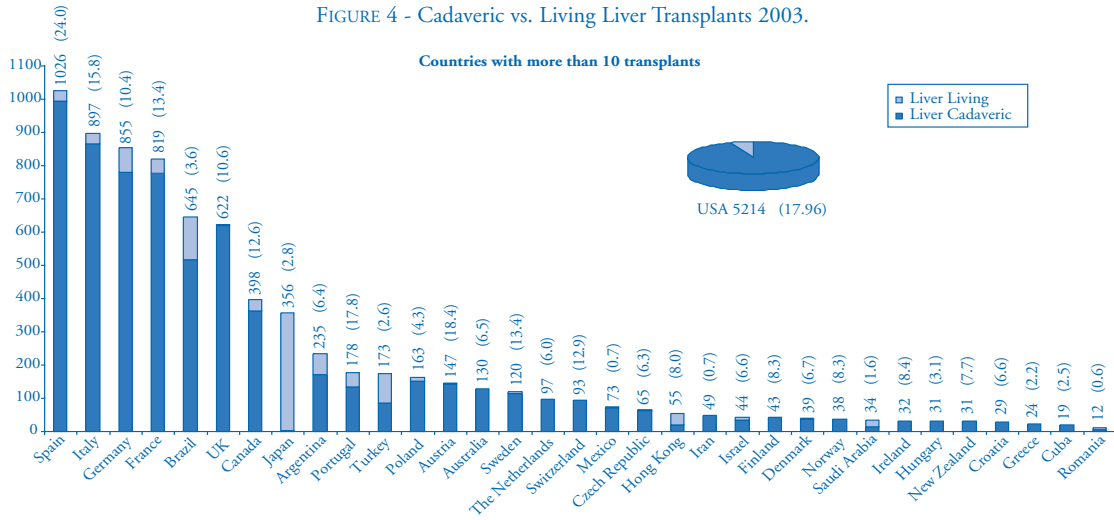


FIGURE 5 - Heart Transplants 2003.

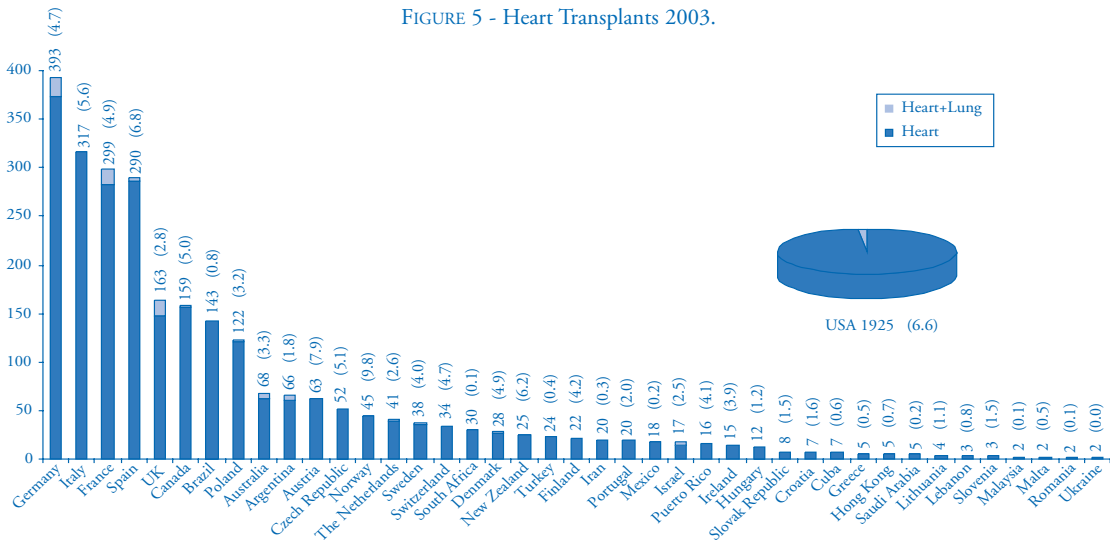


FIGURE 6 - Lung Transplants 2003.
